



Preparing for the Diagnostic Imaging Selection Process

Qualified applicants will receive a selection package from the School of Health and Public Safety. The program will use email as the primary source of communication. Make sure your email account is managed appropriately to receive our emails, files and communications.

Career Investigation

It is important to have a clear understanding of your career choice. Understanding the expectations of each particular program is paramount to your decision. All Diagnostic Imaging programs require a physical ability along with the knowledge attainment. Research your choice so you are the right candidate for the right profession.

Below are some types of questions you can research on your own to prepare for your career investigation:

- What are the daily responsibilities of your chosen career path?
- What are the drawbacks of working in this profession?
- What are the physical requirements of the profession?
- What attributes are associated with the profession?
- What are the major patient responsibilities of the profession?
- What are the educational expectations for the profession?
- Would I have to relocate for my practicum?

You can potentially be with a patient for 15 minutes to over an hour and they can be acutely sick, scared and uncomfortable; are you prepared to work with patients in those environments? Do you know what “professional” looks like and acts like? Are you prepared for the length and requirements of your education?”

Interview

The Diagnostic Imaging profession requires:

- Being articulate.
- Using appropriate medical terminology.
- The ability to communicate effectively with patient and other intra-professional staff.
- Professional communication
