

Ombudsperson Update

If you don't completely understand what an "Ombudsperson" does, it's probably not your fault. The reality is that ombuds departments, and the role of ombudspersons themselves, will probably always be misunderstood to some extent. There are many reasons behind this misunderstanding, but some of the more interesting ones include:

- 1. Any variation of the word "ombuds" is inherently foreign to most people, especially to those without a background in Scandinavian languages (ombudsman is a Swedish word commonly translated as 'delegate', 'representative', or 'advocate');
- 2. An independent and confidential support department like this easily conjures up a mental image of a massive room staffed by a huge team of fairness advocates (almost never the case in postsecondary education, e.g. SAIT has *one* Ombudsperson);
- 3. Not all ombudspersons are created equal; a military ombuds serves a different purpose than the CBC Ombudsman, who operates differently than the Office of the Alberta Ombudsman, which exists on an entirely different scale than the SAIT Ombudsperson.

Fortunately, accurate understanding is not a prerequisite for accessing this resource. Staff, students, and faculty are welcome to reach out when they need a confidential space to discuss confusion or conflict they've encountered, including with a SAIT decision, policy, procedure, or regulation.

The easiest way to connect is by **booking an appointment online** through the <u>Office of the Ombudsperson website</u>. Email, phone, or drop-in inquiries are also possible, however it's always best to nail down an exact time so you can know exactly when you will be able to access assistance.

Introduction to Equity, Diversity and Inclusion course at SAIT

Introduction to Equity, Diversity and Inclusion at SAIT is a one-hour online, asynchronous course which introduces foundational principles, concepts and terms related to equity, diversity and inclusion (EDI). It is designed to be the starting point for employees on their individual EDI journeys. Learners will begin to grow their understanding of self and how to relate to others, as well as identify tangible ways to promote a healthy campus environment where everyone feels welcome, respected and empowered to succeed.

Learning Objectives:

- Identify the current components of equity, diversity, and inclusion at SAIT
- Describe the foundational principles, concepts, and terms of equity, diversity, and inclusion
- Develop self-awareness and ways to respectfully work across differences
- Recognize the professional development opportunities available to continue EDI learning at SAIT
