Position Title: MacPhail Student Reporter

Department or School: MacPhail School of Energy Term: Fall 2024 and Winter 2025 semesters

Number of Positions: 1 Hours per week: 3-5

This is a competitive student leadership opportunity open to current SAIT students. Competition for leadership positions will close as suitable candidates are hired.

Position Description

There is a great deal of change happening in the energy industry as this vibrant and exciting sector works through the enormous technical and business challenges of the Energy Transition towards a low carbon economy. There are also many exciting things happening within MacPhail and across SAIT such as student club events, industry speakers and a wide variety of other events for the MacPhail community to be aware of. The MacPhail Student Reporter will use their resourcefulness, passion for knowledge and information and exceptional writing skills to work with our Administrative and Leadership teams to produce a periodic newsletter for the MacPhail community including students, faculty and staff.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Build a knowledge network, leveraging faculty and students, to keep a pulse on significant developments in the energy industry as sources of information for a periodic newsletter publication
- Liaise with the Student Club Collaboration Student Leader to keep up to date on events and goings on in Student Clubs across MacPhail with a view to broadening awareness and promoting activities
- With support from the MacPhail Leadership representative, collate and prioritize the information gathered to include in the periodic publication (likely monthly but to be determined)
- Using your creativity, exceptional writing skills and knowledge of publishing applications, develop the "emPOWERing MacPhail Newsletter" which will serve as a means of sharing information and creating engagement in the MacPhail community.
- Develop ideas and create content for social media posts on behalf of MacPhail leadership
- Attend student leadership training and other relevant professional development and training sessions that will be offered throughout each semester.
- Engage in other duties as opportunities allow.
